Mayor Barney Rush and Purple Line Mitigation Committee members Rich Brancato, Jeff Marqusee, and Stuart Sessions presented a slideshow on issues related to the light rail project, including the elevation and appearance of the project, the appearance of the trains themselves, the construction schedule, noise, visual privacy, storm water management and access under or across the tracks.
