I refer to correspondence dated January 31, 2017 addressed to Mr. William Parks, and sent by Mrs. Marian Honecny (see enclosed). This letter granted FCP approval conditional upon the "Judges' Ruling" reinstating the project's federal approval enabling construction to advance. Based upon the recent ruling from the D.C. Circuit, please be advised that the Forest Conservation Plan (FCP) is hereby **approved**.

A copy of the stamped plan should be available at the construction site prior to our first inspection. This inspection shall occur before any construction activity begins, to determine whether forest protection measures have been installed and conservation areas are clearly marked on site (COMAR 08.19.04.14).


