Minutes

- Dan used a PowerPoint to lead the meeting discussion.
- The prior month meeting minutes were approved.
- Forecast Tip: Sally has done a “Fast Fashion” tip for the December Forecast. Need a signup for the January Forecast.
- Key topics discussed:
 - Rosemary Garden – Dan gave an update on the adjacent neighbors’ meeting and next steps that Sheila and team are driving. Overall, the adjacent neighbor meeting was a very productive use of time and hopefully brought the neighbors and CEC into closer alignment on what to do at Rosemary Triangle.
 - Stormwater Mgmt (SWM) Update – Stuart and Dan gave some brief updates on SWM including their meeting with Ann English with County RainScapes program and a 5 person meeting with Joy, Dan, Stuart, Todd Hoffman and Dave Walton to discuss next steps for SWM and ARPA planning and projects. Todd will be updating Town Council at their November 9 meeting.
Town Staff are working on a list of known trouble spots and they will propose some work in those areas some of which will be done as independent projects and some of which make sense to complete in connection with other work the Town or our utility companies will be doing. Once that list is approved by Town Council we can see the extent of those projects and timing. Stuart also introduced the idea of potentially using another contractor such as Chesapeake Bay Trust to run a RainScapes-like program instead of relying on the County which lately has had serious budget and staffing issues for RainScapes such that the Town will not be able to use the funds allocated for the RainScapes Supplemental Rebate Program. This idea can be visited after the next Town Council discussion.
 - Fall Festival – Oct 15, 12-3pm – After 2 festival tabling events, it is clear that these are not effective communication opportunities. Residents are at the festivals for other reasons and we don’t get much foot traffic. We should look for other opportunities to do such tabling in Town, or schedule a CEC-specific event.
 - Sally brought up the issue of carbon footprint of our food choices – good topic for a tip – January anyone?
 - Sally brought up the idea of installing solar carports at Lawton Center which could help landscapers with their battery charging. Would need to be a project

coordinated with the County since we lease Lawton Center space from the County.
