## Council To Discuss Tree Policies

On **January 30** at 7 p.m. in the Town Hall, the Town Council will hold a work session to discuss the Town's current tree protection policies and procedures. At this meeting, the Council will review the feedback it has received from residents since the devastating summer storm that resulted in significant tree damage in Town. Following that storm, the Town hosted a public meeting in October to review the Town's existing practices to safely preserve the Town's tree canopy.

At the January 30 work session, the Council will discuss the goals and objectives of the Town's current tree-related laws and will hear from the Climate and Environment Committee, which was tasked by the Council to recommend new Town-sponsored initiatives or programs to encourage residents to provide for the care and maintenance of canopy trees on private property. The Council will then determine next steps. We will advertise any future meetings or public hearings on this matter.

## Public Works Projects Update

### Storm Drainage Improvements

Montgomery County is making good progress on the third and final phase of storm sewer repairs in Town. Following completion of the repairs on Meadow Lane and Rosemary Street, the contractor will begin working on Sycamore Street. Residents should obey posted "No Parking" signs that indicate when the work will begin.

A map of the proposed work areas has been posted on the Town website, although the plans are subject to change based on existing utility locations and site constraints.

### Concrete Repair

The Town will be performing concrete repairs in January. Areas to be repaired have been marked with white paint. Residents should obey posted "No Parking" signs that will indicate when the work will begin.

# Town Updates

## New 2013-2014 Resident Directory Planned

The Town is preparing to update the Resident Directory for the 2013-2014 calendar years. The Directory is a great resource for connecting with your neighbors. The Town will mail authorization cards during the second week of January. These cards need to be returned by mail or dropped off at the Town Office by **January 31** in order for residents to be included in the Directory. Please feel free to include partial information if you do not wish to include all of your contact information in the Directory. The Resident Directory is only made available to Town residents. The Town does not sell or make it available to non-Town residents or any other third party.

The Town cannot include residents in the Directory without express written authorization from them. We are hoping that this year's Directory will be the most complete and comprehensive edition that we have ever published; however, without your authorization you cannot be included. It is very important that you return the card that authorizes your inclusion.

## Town of Chevy Chase Tree Programs

The Town of Chevy Chase has proudly administered several tree-related programs for over a decade in an effort to preserve the Town's beautiful tree canopy. We want to remind residents of these programs and encourage you to take advantage of them. Additional information on each program below can be found on the Town's website at [www.townofchevyCHASE.org](http://www.townofchevyCHASE.org).

### Consulting Arborist Program

The Consulting Arborist program allows each residence an opportunity to consult with the Town's arborist every two years regarding the health of trees on private property. Upon a resident's express request, by phone call or through the Town's website ([www.townofchevyCHASE.org](http://www.townofchevyCHASE.org)), the arborist will visit the property and provide a written report regarding tree health and care, as well as issues pertaining to infestations and hazardous conditions.

### Native Tree Canopy Planting

Each year the Town has a limited number of native canopy trees available for planting on private property. These trees are available on a first come, first served, basis. At a resident's request, the arborist will visit the property and determine if the requested location is appropriate for a tree. Requests can be made through the Town's website (under "E-Documents") or by filling out an application at the Town Office.

### Public Tree Planting

The Town welcomes requests from residents for trees to be planted along the right-of-way. When a request is made, the arborist will visit the site and determine if the requested location and type of tree are appropriate. Requests can be made via the Town's website (under "E-Documents"), or by completing a request form at the Town Office.

### Public Tree Maintenance

Any resident who believes a tree along the right-of-way is in need of maintenance is encouraged to call the Town Office or use the online form (under "E-Documents") to request that the Town arborist inspect the tree.

As a reminder, if you would like to remove a canopy tree on private property that is at least 24 inches in circumference, you must submit a tree removal permit. The permit can be found under the "E-Documents" link on the website. Once a permit has been submitted, the Town Manager, in consultation with the arborist, will determine whether to grant or deny the request.

### Tree Tip of the Month

Winter is the best time to have your trees pruned, according to the Town arborist Tolbert Feather. Because it's a slack time of year for tree companies, they can generally get to work faster and charge less than during busier times of the year. Here are some guidelines for selecting a tree service:

- hire a certified arborist (<http://www.isa-arbor.com/faca/findArborist.aspx>, <http://www.goodtreecare.com/search/index.cfm>);
- ask for proof of insurance;
- check for necessary permits and licenses;
- ask for and call references;
- get more than one bid and don't necessarily take the lowest one;
- beware of door-to-door tree service solicitations;
- get the agreement for work to be performed up front and do not hesitate to place all items discussed in the contract including clean up and any accidental damage to additional trees, landscape, driveways and sidewalks;
- don't pay until all work is completed satisfactorily

### Calling all tree lovers!

Casey Trees (a non-profit in Washington, DC) offers a free "Citizen Forester" training program (3 free courses)! Citizen Foresters are Casey Trees-trained volunteers who teach new volunteers how to properly plant and care for trees and spread the word about the value of urban forests. The Climate and Environment Committee encourages tree lovers in Town to take the course and help the Town create a healthy and safe tree canopy in town. ### Please Remember to Shovel Your Sidewalk

It is important after inclement weather to make sure that the sidewalk adjacent to your house is cleared of snow and ice. If the accumulated snowfall is under 3 inches, you will be responsible for clearing the sidewalk. The Town will assist with the clearing of public sidewalks when snow accumulates to 3 inches or more. This snow removal plan will assist residents with clearing sidewalks following significant snowstorms, when help is needed most.
